Cost includes all materials to make 1 slide and 1 pair of earrings or 2 slides. \$20.00

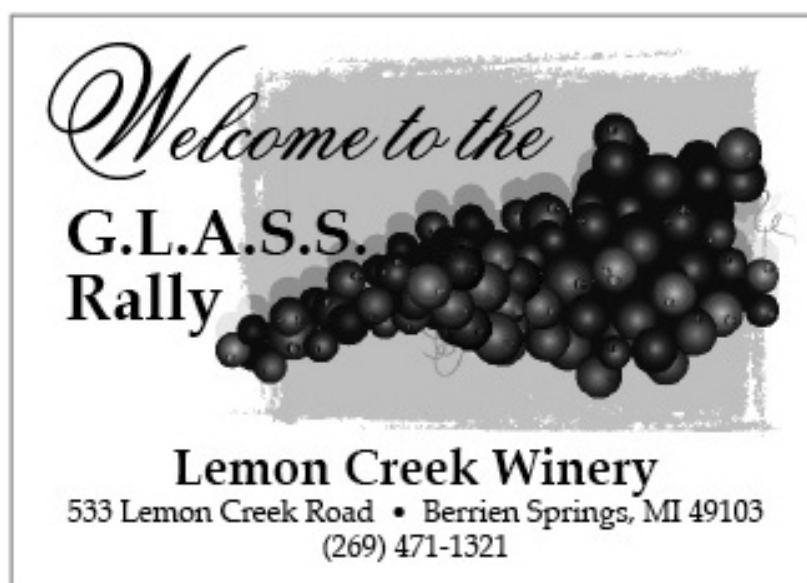
